

** California Department of Education Awards Residency Capacity Grant to CCOG and Santa Ana USD**

The Center to Close the Opportunity Gap (CCOG) and the Santa Ana Unified School District (SAUSD) have made notable progress in their mission to close the opportunity gap in education. The California Department of Education has awarded them the School Counselor Residency Capacity Grant for their initiative, "Project PREP" (Professional Residency Experience Program).

Project PREP is a collaboration between SAUSD and California State University, Long Beach (CSULB), designed to develop a school counselor residency program. The primary goal is twofold: to provide practical training and experience to CSULB School Counseling graduate students and to tackle the shortage of school counselors within the Santa Ana Unified School District.
